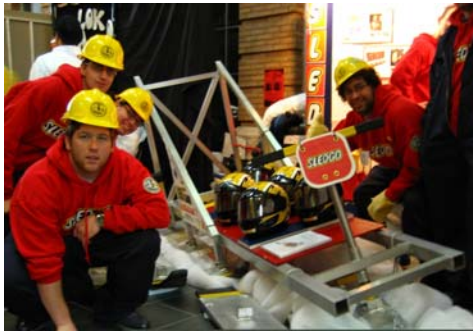


**UNIVERSITY OF WATERLOO'S
